Women in Black London stand in mourning for all women killed by men.

We stand in solidarity with women who have experienced rape and assault and gender oppression in the UK and across the world.

Women in Black see a continuum between domestic violence and war. Patriarchal, patrimonial attitudes at home disregard the voices and needs of women as primary care givers and agricultural workers, and lead to extreme acts of violence and war.

Women in Black see a continuum between misogyny promoted online and domestic violence.
