

Justice for Gaza and West Bank

Human suffering in Gaza intensifies as we reach the end of the second year of this conflict. The death toll to date is over 65,000. The UN has now confirmed that genocide is taking place there. https://www.ohchr.org/en/press-releases/2025/09/israel-has-committed-genocide-gaza-strip-un-commission-finds

- Famine and acute malnourishment, especially of children, are now occurring in many parts of Gaza
 affecting at least 500,000 adults and more than 132,000 children under 5 in August 2025. Vital
 cropland and water supplies have been massively damaged by Israeli bombardment. The destruction
 in Gaza will take decades to address.
- 2,500 people seeking aid have been killed since 27th May.
- Since Israel began its attacks, 38 Gaza hospitals and 96 healthcare centres have been targeted, and 197 ambulances were destroyed or damaged by the Israeli army. https://www.aa.com.tr/en/middle-east/israeli-army-strikes-another-gaza-hospital-blocks-access-health-ministry/3701844.
- Israel does not allow international media into Gaza and its attacks continue to kill those who
 courageously report from there. Since October 2023, 245 journalists and media workers, including 33
 female journalists, have been killed and at least 520 injured, while 140 have been arrested and
 imprisoned by Israeli authorities.

IS ISRAEL TRYING TO MAKE IT IMPOSSIBLE TO ESTABLISH A PALESTINIAN STATE IN THE WEST BANK?

Israel may be exploiting the focus on Gaza to divert attention from ongoing settler attacks on Palestinians in the West Bank. It is accelerating the establishment of settlements and may try to annex the whole West Bank according to the UN Security Council. It has also unblocked several projects to create new industrial zones and expand settlements and is now thinking of splitting the West Bank in two, which would isolate Palestinian populations and make it more difficult to establish a Palestinian state. https://press.un.org/en/2025/sc16183.doc.htm

With them, we call for full equality in Israel for Jewish and non-Jewish citizens alike.
