While Gaza suffers Israel takes over the West Bank and the UK stays silent

While the international community fails to take action on Palestine, Israel is accelerating the establishment of illegal settlements in the West Bank. It now plans a 'bypass' road for the use of Israelis only, and a new wall in the North Jordan Valley, which will close off the core of the occupied West Bank and its roads to Palestinians. This is an area vital for the establishment of a future Palestinian state. The road is planned to lead to a large settlement, Ma'ale Adumim, to expand further and link to Jerusalem.

Israeli authorities also propose to approve 9,000 'settlement units' on the site of the former Jerusalem airport, and a project in Sheikh Jarrah (the mainly Palestinian area of East Jerusalem) to displace 40 families. These plans will massively expand the area of Jerusalem, bisecting the West Bank and further undermining the possibility of a two-state solution. It will also make it impossible to establish East Jerusalem as the future capital of a Palestinian state.

Israel has moved to close down UNRWA, depriving it of access to water, power, and communications. Israel also announced on 30 December 2025 a new regulation banning 37 international NGOs, including ActionAid, International Rescue Committee, Médecins Sans Frontières and Medical Aid for Palestinians, from operating in Gaza and the West Bank. UN experts say that the ban makes life unbearable for genocide survivors in Palestine.

All this is taking place while Israel continues its deadly attacks on Gaza, in defiance of the so-called ceasefire and the global community continues to fail to act. What chance is there for Trump's newly created Gaza "board of peace" a body he claims will steer the next phase of reconstruction and governance in the war-ravaged territory (though without any Palestinians or women included)?
